

TR12 – CRANE SUPERVISOR – 3 DAY

COURSE AIM

The aim of this course is to provide delegates with the knowledge and practical skills in the supervision of lifting operations. Following the successful completion of the course, the delegate will be able to understanding the safe systems of work for lifting operations including use of risk assessments & method statements.

The course is 3 days and the content is quite substantial and covers the following areas: -

- Regulation
- Duties of Personnel involved in a Lifting Operation
- Lifting Accessories, Types, Pre-use, Safe use, & Selection
- Marking of SWL, Mode Factors & Sling Angle Calculations
- Types of Crane & Lifting Operations
- Crane Duties Charts
- Briefings / Tool Box Talks
- Risk Assessment & Method Statement
- Crane Hand Signals
- Practical Operations of Delivering Briefings, Siting the Crane & Conducting Safe Lifting Operations

Each course delegate will be expected to complete a theory and practical examination. If successful, a certificate will be issued. This will help the Employer to address certain legal requirements by being able to demonstrate employee competency. A detailed course handout is also provided for future reference.

Note: Where training provided is not specific to the type of lifting operations that the trainee will be undertaking, their employer should ensure supplementary training and competency assessment is undertaken.

DURATION

The standard course is intended to last 3 day but for an experienced Lift Supervisor who holds a valid or recently expired certificate, a 2 day refresher can be attended. Bespoke courses can also be discussed.

The 3 day course assumes the candidate to already be qualified / experienced in the roles of either a Slinger / Banksmen or Crane Operator.

LOCATION

The course is generally held at our Head Office at Harworth, however we are also able to utilise other Certex locations, or hold courses at Client premises if adequate facilities are available.

WHAT DELEGATES WILL NEED TO BRING

Each delegate is required to produce photographic ID and certificates of training for Slinger/Banksmen, Crane Operator on the first day of the course. Failure to do so will result in the delegate being unable to attend.

If this course is held at a Certex UK location, safety footwear and hard hat is required however, if the course is to be held on a Client's site, additional PPE may be also be required as specified by the Client's site safety rules.
